A WEEKEND OF FREE DENTAL CARE AT THE

CLINIC

We're thrilled to share some exiting news from the clinic. Over the weekend of May 2-3, our team hosted a two-day dental outreach event in partnership with Send Relief and Serve Evansville. With the support of a passionate group of volunteers, including dentists, oral surgeons, hygienists, and community members, we were able to provide completely free dental care to 90 individuals in our community.

This event came together thanks to the generosity and vision of Dr. Austin Hixenbaugh, who approached us just six weeks prior with the idea. With his help, along with Natalie, our dedicated dental hygienist, the event came to life in a way that far exceeded expectations.

In addition to the care provided, Send Relief generously covered the cost of the supplies used throughout the weekend. We're also incredibly grateful to the Southwestern Indiana Oral Health Foundation, who is funding a brand-new **Caringa Digital Sensor (bitewing sensor)** that will significantly improve our ability to deliver timely, accurate imaging and dental care in the clinic moving forward.



"Together, we're building something beautiful." The atmosphere at the clinic was something special, filled with energy, kindness, and teamwork. All new dentists served alongside three oral surgeons, and together, they created an environment that was welcoming and uplifting. Volunteers from Mt. Vernon, IL helped greet clients at the door, offering support, conversation, and encouragement as people waited for care.

Over the course of the weekend, a total of 90 patients received free, high quality dental care, many of whom had not seen a dentist in years. Across both days, our team performed an incredible 85 extractions, 23 exams, 33 restorations, and 2 consultations. Each patient walked away with not only relief from pain, but with dignity and confidence that comes from being truly cared for.

We're incredibly grateful to everyone who made this weekend possible, including those who served, those who donated, and those who cheered us on behind the scenes. Your involvement makes a lasting difference, one smile at a time.

Applying Advance Adhesion Knowledge to Achieve Esthetic and Predictable Direct Anterior and Posterior Comp Restorations, including Rehabilitation

The goal of a responsible clinician is to provide his or her patients with functional, long lasting, and esthetically pleasing anterior and posterior restorations, in the most conservative and bio-compatible fashion; direct composites can be technique sensitive, difficult, time consuming and often financially unrewarding procedures; this may, in large part, be due to the incorrect use of new materials. Some of the new material require a completely new approach, if we are going to be successful with them. Dr. Ruiz presents a completely new, scientifically based, approach to tooth preparation and restoration of the most widely performed procedures in dentistry direct composites, using supra-gingival principles.

Dr. Ruiz will review the latest knowledge in advance adhesion, techniques, materials, and will review the principles necessary to perform exquisite, predictable and simple, direct anterior and posterior composite restorations, including rehabilitation with direct composite.

About the Speaker

Dr. Ruiz is founder of the "Supra-gingival Minimally Invasive Dentistry" movement, as well as founder and director of the Los Angeles Institute of Clinical Dentistry. Former Course Director of numerous CE Courses at the University of Southern California (USC). He is an Honorary Clinical Professor at Warrick University in England and a member of the editorial board for Dentistry Today. He is also an Associate Instructor at Dr. Gordan Christensen PCC in Utah & an independent evaluator of dental products for CR (CRA). Dr. Ruiz has been named as one of the "Leaders in CE 2006-Present" by Dentistry Today.

Dr. Ruiz is the author of the textbook "Supra-gingival Minimally Invasive Dentistry; A Healthier Approach" published by Wiley-Blackwell and edited by Dr. Ray Bertolottie and has also published several research papers as well as many clinical articles on adhesive dentistry, occlusion and esthetic dentistry. He regularly lectures at all major dental meetings, nationally and internationally.

Dr. Ruiz has been practicing in the studio district of Los Angeles for over 25 years and enjoys a clientele of many stars and entertainers. His focus os on treating complex Cosmetic, Rehabilitation, and Implant cases.
