## Course Description & Objectives

### Differential Diagnoses for Oral Ulcers

The course is designed to deepen the understanding of the causes, diagnosis and management of oral ulcers. The course will cover a range of topics, including the differentiation between types of ulcers, such as traumatic ulcers, aphthous stomatitis and ulcers caused by systemic diseases. Emphasis will be placed on practical diagnostic techniques, effective treatment plans, and strategies for prevention and patient education.

Angela Ritchie, DDS MS, is an Assistant Clinical Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology at Indiana University School of Dentistry (IUSD) in the Department of Oral Pathology, Medicine, and Radiology. At IUSD, she also serves as Director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology Group biopsy service. She actively participates in the Dental Faculty Practice where she is one of two specialists in the entire state of Indiana providing highly specialized care to patients throughout the Midwest. Dr. Ritchie has authored several peer-reviewed articles for high impact journals including case reports and systematic reviews. She is currently the course director for the pre-graduate dental course in oral and maxillofacial pathology where she has implemented new and innovative teaching strategies, including TopHat, to engage active learning in the classroom.

### Pediatric Oral Radiology: From Radiation Safety to Lesions and CBCT

The seminar will provide to the attendee the most common radiographic lesions that are presented in infants, children, and adolescents. ## About the Speaker

Juan F. Yepes DDS, MD, MPH, MS, DrPH is a full professor in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry and the associate dean for graduate education at Indiana University School of Dentistry and an attending at Riley Children's Hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana. Juan F. is also a clinical professor at the University at Buffalo. Juan F. is a dentist (DDS) and physician (MD) from Javeriana University Bogotá, Colombia. In 1999, Juan F. moved to the USA and attended the University of Iowa and the University of Pennsylvania where he completed a fellowship and residency in Radiology and Oral Medicine respectively in 2002 and 2004. In 2006, Juan F. completed a Master in Public Health (MPH), and in 2011 a Doctoral Degree in Public Health (DrPH) both with emphasis in Epidemiology at the University of Kentucky College of Public Health. In 2008, Juan F. completed a residency program in Dental Public Health at University of Texas, Baylor College of Dentistry. Finally, Juan F. completed a residency program and a master in pediatric dentistry at the University of Kentucky in 2012.

Juan F. is board-certified by the American Boards of Pediatric Dentistry, Oral Medicine, and Dental Public Health. He is an active member of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, American Academy of Oral Medicine, American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology, Indiana Dental Association, and American Dental Association. Juan F. is a fellow in dental surgery from the Royal College of Surgeons at Edinburgh. He is a member of the editorial board of Oral Surgery, Oral Medicine, Oral Pathology, and Oral Radiology. Finally, Juan F. is the associate editor of the Journal of the American Dental Association (JADA).
